You probably know exactly which cut of jeans slim and elongate your legs, which colours make you look washed out and which party dress style creates the perfect hourglass shape. But do you know which handbag shapes, sizes and colours will make the most out of your body?

### HOURGLASS

Like Beyonce, you have a typical womanly shape, with an equal hips to bust ratio and a smaller waist.

The rule of thumb states that wherever a bag falls it will draw attention. If you're lucky enough to have a small hourglass waist you should emphasise it with a structured tote, perhaps in a bright eye-catching colour. The rectangular shape will help balance out against your curves. Don't forget to think about your height - the taller you are, the bigger the size bag you can get away with.

Your weight sits on your bum, hips and thighs, and you tend to have narrower shoulders just like Shakira.

To help create the illusion of a larger bust (and take away attention from your lower half) opt for a bag that hangs right underneath your armpit, such as a shopper, or a tote with shorter straps. If you're a slim pear, experiment with bolder patterns and details. If you've a fuller figure, darker colours will create a sleeker silhouette. Steer clear of chain or cross body bags as these will add inches to your widest part.
